Background

- The Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC) created the OBAG Program to distribute federal funds from Federal Surface Transportation Acts starting in 2012
- There have been two prior cycles of OBAG: OBAG 1 in 2012 and OBAG 2 in 2016 Projects listed in Attachment B
- With OBAG 2 expiring, MTC adopted policies and guidelines in March 2022 for OBAG 3 to distribute federal transportation funds from the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA), also known as the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL)



Background (cont.)

- OBAG 3 funds will be programmed over a four-year period from FY 22/23 to FY 25/26
- OBAG 3 will continue the general policies adopted during OBAG 1 and 2 with new considerations to address contemporary concerns and priorities
- In particular, OBAG 3 emphasizes projects and programs that improve safety, spur economic development, support Equity Priority Communities, and help the Bay Area meet climate change and air quality improvement goals
- OBAG3 continues to include CTA Planning funds to support CTAs in carrying out planning and programming activities, similar amounts to prior cycles





Funds Available in OBAG 3

• OBAG 3 will have \$750 million available for programming over the four-year period

• Additional federal funding from IIJA may become available later for MTC to augment OBAG 3 and will require further approval from the MTC Commission



Marin's Share and Overall Process

- MTC has established a nomination target of 120% of the available funds that CTAs may submit
- The 120% nomination target of \$340 million in available funds is \$408 million
- Each CTA's nomination target is calculated using the following factors:
 - 50% Population
 - 30% Housing Production
 - 20% Planned Growth
- Based on these factors, Marin's share for the County and Local Program funds was calculated at 2.8%, which amounts to approximately \$9.6 million
- Marin's nomination target of 120% is \$11.5 million
- CTAs to nominate projects, MTC makes final selection for whole region
- MTC has indicated that OBAG 3 nomination targets do not commit or imply a guaranteed share
 of funding to any individual CTA, but MTC will make attempt to select projects amounting to
 the targeted share for each CTA as close as possible; some CTAs may receive slightly more
 funds than their targets while others may receive slightly less



Nomination Target Adjustment

- Staff proposes to adjust the nomination target of \$11.5 million by \$400,000 for allowable local planning activities
- TAM will be conducting a Countywide Transportation Plan (CTP) with the setaside funds as discussed with the TAM Board in April 2022
- Based on nominations received, TAM will submit project nominations up to the adjusted amount of \$11,144,000 in funding requests to MTC



Call for Projects Schedule

• TAM has been directed to issue a Call for Projects for a County and Local Program after MTC releases the Regional Call for Nominations in mid-May

MTC Evaluation and Prioritization Criteria

- Evaluation and Prioritization Criteria applications are evaluated and prioritized on the criteria required by MTC and proposed by TAM:
 - MTC Required
 - Located PDA/TRA
 - Support Housing Policies
 - Invested in Underserved Communities
 - Align with Plan Bay Area Strategies
 - Consistent with Regional Plans
 - Demonstrate Public Support
 - Support Regional Performance Goals



Local Criteria

- Attachment A is TAM's proposed Local Criteria, including:
 - Initial Screening Criteria Screen for eligibility, regional plan consistency, and deliverability
 - Priority Development Area (PDA) Minimum Investments At least 50% of funds must be programmed to projects located within or connected to a PDA. Marin has four PDAs:
 - Downtown San Rafael
 - Unincorporated Highway 101 Corridor
 - Southeast San Rafael
 - Northgate
 - Eligible and Ineligible Projects for Funding
 - Sponsor and Project Requirements
 - Eligible Sponsors Cities, Counties, Transit Agencies, Federally-Recognized Tribal Governments, and TAM.



Local Criteria (cont.)

- Considered Countywide or Regional Significance
- Located in Multiple Jurisdictions with evidence of support from each
- Contribute more than requisite local match for federal funds for project nominations that are not in disadvantaged communities; projects located in disadvantaged communities need only contribute the required local match
- Promote or enhance multi-modal access
- Address safety improvement
- Review Committee TAM staff will strive to find a balanced committee representing a variety of perspectives and generally familiar with the types of capital projects, including:

Marin Public Works Association (MPWA) or Planning Manager, Community Development Director, and County Office of Education or School District, or County's Office of Equity

Regional Programs

- OBAG 3 Regional Programs will be administered by MTC
- 50% of the funds, or \$375 million, will be available for Regional Programs
- Intended to provide funding for projects and programs addressing current issues such as climate change, equity, transit recovery, and planning, on a regional scale
- MTC staff is still developing the program details
- In prior OBAG cycles, the Priority Conservation Area (PCA) Program was a part of the Regional Programs that provided specified amounts of funding for the four North Bay Counties
- MTC staff has indicated that they will be undertaking a PCA study over the next 18 months and any PCA funding decisions will follow the study
- TAM staff will continue to track the Regional Programs and share information about funding opportunities as they become available



Next Steps

- Upon approval by the TAM Board, release the OBAG 3 County and Local Program Call for Projects no later than May 31, 2022
- Include CMA planning funds in proposed TAM Annual Budget for FY22-23
- Conduct project evaluation process and return to TAM Board in September with recommendations
- Continue to track OBAG 3 Regional Programs for funding opportunities
