Re: Point San Pedro Road Coalition’s Support for the City of San Rafael’s Grant Application for Safer Crosswalk to Schools

Dear Executive Director Richman:

On behalf of the Point San Pedro Road Coalition, a non-profit organization representing the interests of residents and neighborhood associations along the Point San Pedro Road corridor in East San Rafael, we are writing to express our strong support for the City of San Rafael’s grant application to install a pedestrian-activated light at the intersection of Knight Drive and Point San Pedro Road.

The Coalition has long prioritized safety improvements to Point San Pedro Road for all—motorists, cyclists, and pedestrians. The intersection of Knight Drive and Point San Pedro Road is a critical access point for the Glenwood neighborhood, as well as Glenwood Elementary School, Redeemer Preschool, and surrounding parks. Each day, hundreds of schoolchildren, parents, and residents traverse this intersection with limited visibility which makes it hazardous for pedestrians and bicyclists.

Installing a pedestrian-activated light at Knight Drive will provide a clear and immediate safety benefit by making pedestrians more visible to drivers and by calming traffic in the corridor. Beyond safety, the City of San Rafael’s grant application advances broader community goals of promoting walkability, reducing vehicle dependence, and supporting a healthier and more connected Glenwood neighborhood and surrounding schools and parks.

For these reasons, our Coalition respectfully urges TAM to approve funding for this important project. We believe it will deliver lasting benefits to the Glenwood neighborhood and to all residents and visitors of the Point San Pedro Road corridor. Thank you for your consideration.
