## May 14th – Bike to Work Day

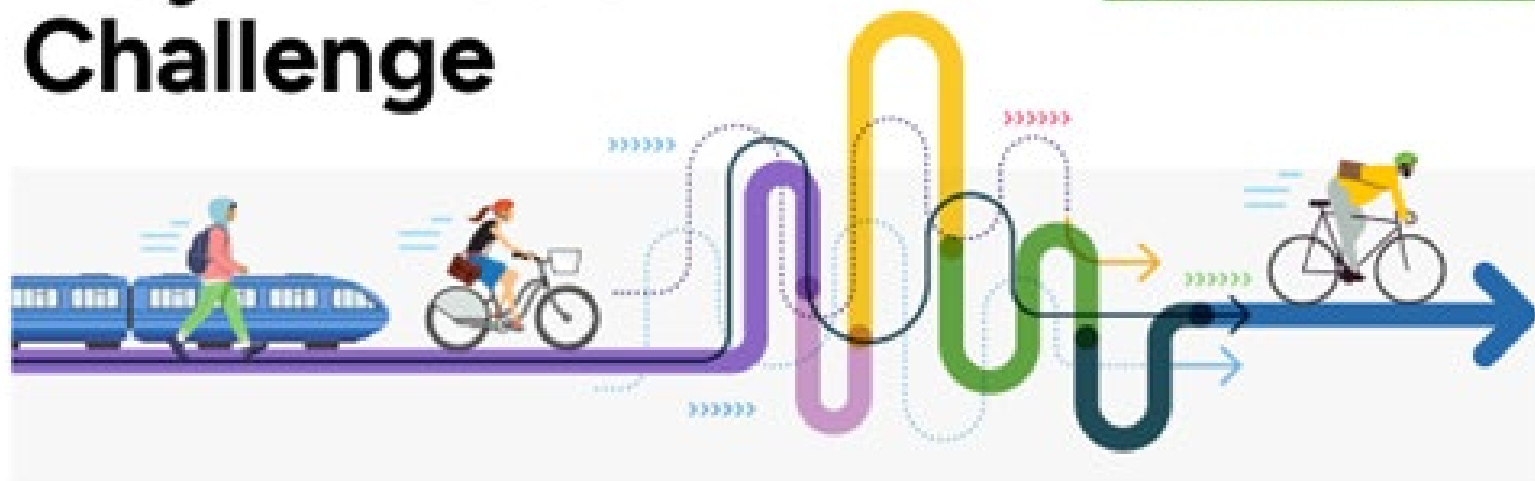
- Featured energizer stations across Marin County

- **Pricing options** include pay-as-you-go, \$20 monthly, and \$5 reduced-fee monthly membership

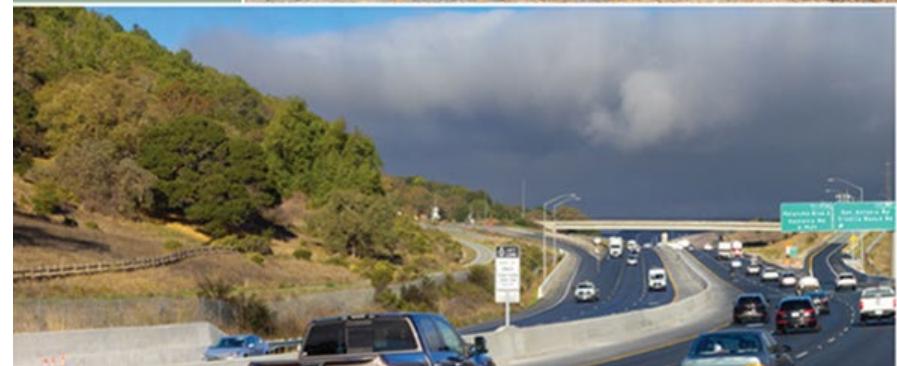

**Crossing Guard of the Year** – Michael Shindelus to be celebrated at the May 28th TAM Board Meeting

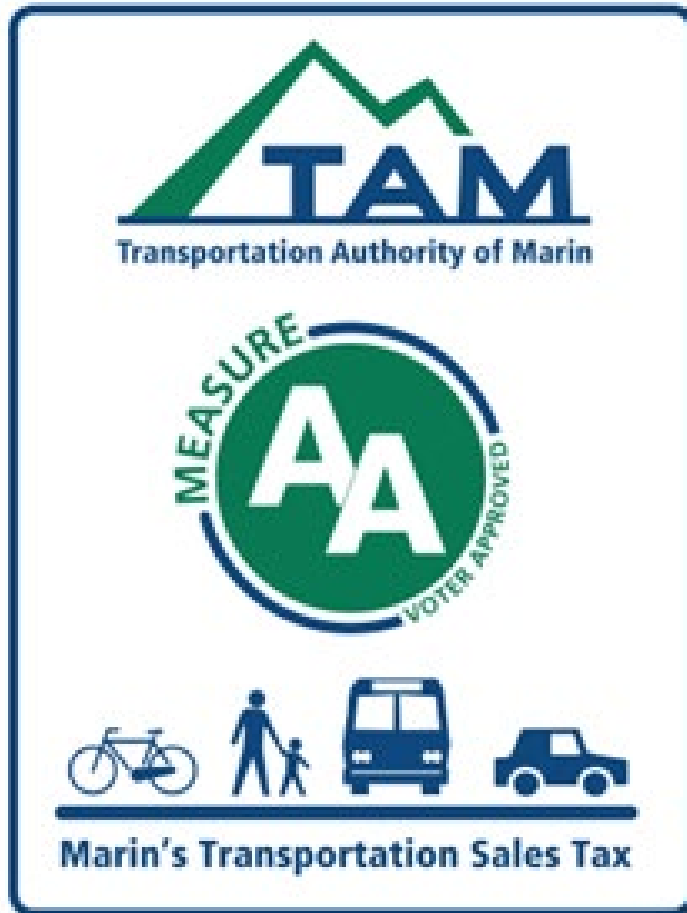
**ACMS Picnic** – Crossing guards gather at Piper Park for annual picnic

- 1 with over 20 years of service



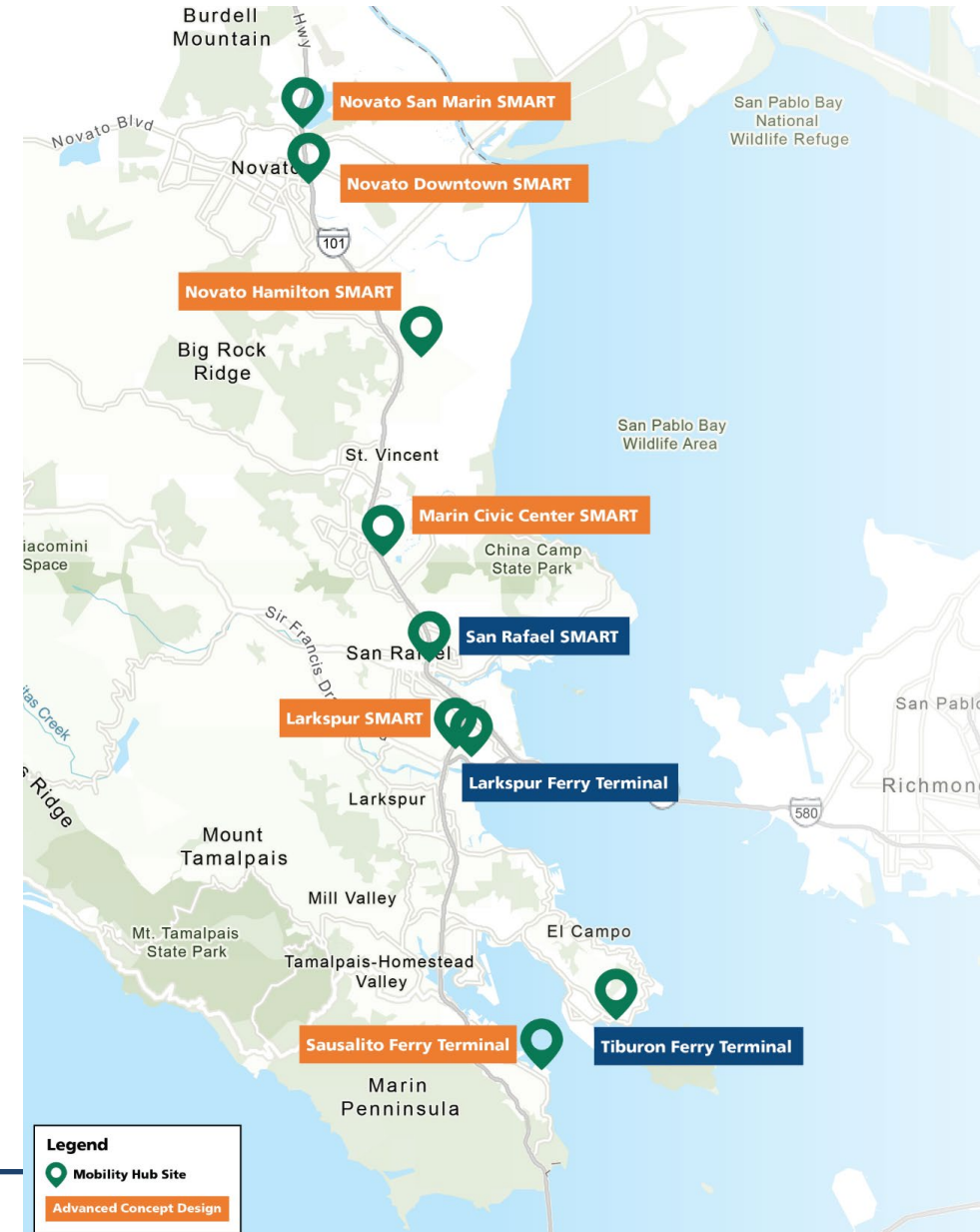
# Measure AA Expenditure Plan Amendments



- Measure AA expenditure plan amendments approved by TAM Board on March 26
- Marin jurisdictions are now considering the amendments for local adoption
- Approved to date by all jurisdictions except for Tiburon (5/20) and Ross (6/11)
- Adoption threshold has been achieved – requires County approval plus majority jurisdiction representing majority population

# Marin County Mobility Hubs Draft Plan Released

- Draft plan released last week
- Comments due June 5th
- TAM action this summer on Final Plan
- Subsequent local actions on Plan
  - TAM staff developed plan to support local jurisdictions and transit operators' needs
  - TAM staff recommends jurisdictions accept report in case TOC policy requirements change
  - Gap closure projects to be incorporated into CIPs and Bike/Ped Plans
- Continued coordination on MTC Transit Oriented Communities Policy
  - \$1-4M available to jurisdictions in non-competitive transportation funding for TOC compliant jurisdictions



# Transit Updates



## MASCOTS Launch

- Coordinated North Bay transit service changes launched April 12
- Updates follow months of planning, coordination, and outreach
- Increased service and better-timed connections
- Simpler network with easier transfers and more all-day options
- Details available through MTC and partner transit agency websites

## SMART Healdsburg Extension Groundbreaking – May 8th

- Foley Family Community Pavilion in Healdsburg
- Design and early construction work already underway
- Passenger service expected to begin in late 2028



# TAM Goes to Washington!



- County of Marin and TAM completed a joint legislative trip to Washington, D.C.
- Trip focused on advancing shared federal priorities and strengthening key relationships
- Meetings covered Marin's FY 27 funding requests and major policy issues
- Topics included transportation, e-bike safety, AI, economic development, and wildfire preparedness
- Visit helps strengthen Marin and TAM's future federal advocacy efforts
