Local Grant Awards



Canal Boatyard Urban Park Connection Project

MTC Priority Conservation Area (PCA) Grant – \$800,000

- City of San Rafael awarded grant for design of shoreline urban park at 620 Canal Street, including pedestrian bridge across the canal
- Part of \$8M in regional PCA grants to protect natural land, support urban greening & outdoor access

Marin Countywide Active Transportation Plan

Caltrans Sustainable Transportation Planning Grant – \$550,000

- TAM awarded grant for Marin's first active transportation network plan
- Prioritize safety & access improvement projects for bicyclists & pedestrians



Active Transportation Program Update

- CTC Active Transportation Program (ATP) Cycle 8 Call for Projects
- \$309M Statewide; \$53M Regional
- Applications due June, awards December
- TAM supported the development & successful submittal of 5 applications:
 - Larkspur – Redwood Highway Westside Active Transportation Bike Path
 - Mill Valley – Safe Routes to Schools/Safe Routes for Seniors Project
 - Novato – Redwood Blvd Sidewalk Gap Closure Project
 - San Anselmo – Creek Park Contraflow Bike Lane Project
 - San Rafael – Manuel T. Freitas Parkway Multi-use Pathway

- Encouraged students to bike to school, promoting healthy lifestyles, bike safety, and community involvement
- Focused on traffic awareness, physical activity, and sharing the road with cyclists
- Celebration at Manor School, bike train from San Anselmo Town Hall to Wade Thomas Elementary

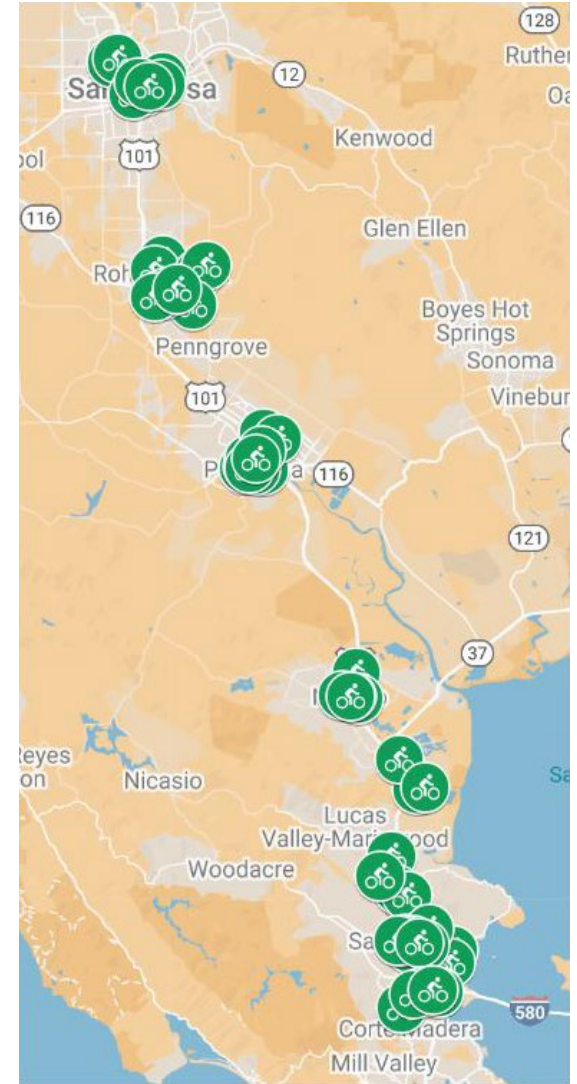
May 14 – Bike to Work Day!

- Featured energizer stations across Marin County
 - TAM, MCBC, MTC, SMART & Golden Gate Transit provided information and give-aways at the Central Marin Ferry Connector
 - Marin Energizer Stations saw a 60 percent increase in riders



Redwood Bikeshare Program

- Initial funding for two-year pilot through Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC) grant
- Launched in October 2024 across 5 cities; remaining cities operational by March 2025
- Current contract expires in October 2026. Three-year extension proposed.
- Agency/Board approvals expected in Sept. for funding and contract actions
- Pending state earmark could add to extension & expansion opportunities if approved
